Notes for the students during the exams

A. Exam venue discipline

Students must take the exams according to the timetable set by the school.

No extra time will be given if students arrive at school late without a valid reason.

Early leave will not be permitted if no special reasons are given.

Students will sit according to their class numbers. The seats will be rearranged in single rows.

The students are prohibited to talk with their classmates during the exam. If there are any questions, students can ask the teachers.

B. The makeup exams and paper review

The make-up exams will be held on 11/6, 12/6 and 15/6; the marks obtained will not be deducted.

If a student cannot attend the make-up exam, the score will not be included in the annual grade; the average will be calculated from the other two terms.

Papers (P.1–P.5) will be returned for correction on 16/6 and 17/6. Parents must sign them. P.5 papers will not be returned and are kept by the school.

C. Internal Assessments for Secondary School Places Allocation

Unless there are special reasons, P.5 students are not allowed to be absent from this examination; the scores from this exam need to be submitted to the Education Bureau's Secondary School Places Allocation Section. If a student is unable to return to school for a makeup exam on the specified date, parents must submit a written application with sufficient reasons, so that our school can apply to the Education Bureau's Secondary School Places Allocation Section for an extension for that student's score submission.

The exam papers will not be returned and will be kept by the school.

D. Arrangement for bad weather

If the Education Bureau announces all primary schools closed in the morning due to a typhoon or other bad weather, the exams will be postponed to the next day.

Arrangements for uploading of Year 23-24 and 24-25 exam papers onto eClass

The exam papers and suggested answers for the Chinese Reading (and Listening), General English and Writing, Mathematics and General Studies will be uploaded onto eClass before 15/6. Parents and students can download the exam papers by following the steps below:

1. Log onto eClass with student identity.
2. Enter 'Classroom Area'
3. Click 'Shared Files'
4. Click 'Public Files'
5. Click 'Past Papers'
6. Choose 'English', 'Chinese', 'Maths' or 'General Studies' folder
7. Click on the past exam papers that you want to read (PDF format)

Since the syllabus may not be the same every year, the past papers in the previous two years may not have the same coverage.

* The Speaking Booklet is a newly introduced teaching material for this year's English subject, providing students with oral exam practice questions, example dialogues, and more, to help enhance their spoken ability and confidence.

** In the General Studies exam, some content will assess students' extracurricular knowledge related to the learning topics, current events, and computer course content.
